

Information clause
for public procurement awarding procedures

Based on Article 13 Section 1 and 2 of the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27.04.2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (general data protection regulation), OJ EU L 119 of 04.05.2016, p. 1, as amended, hereinafter referred to as "GDPR", you are informed that:

1. The Data Controller of your personal data is the Institute of Physics of the Polish Academy of Sciences., Al. Lotników 32/46. 02-668 Warsaw;

3. Your personal data will be processed on the basis of Article 6 Section 1 Letter c) of the GDPR in connection with Article 32-34 of the Act of 29.01.2004 Public Procurement Law (Journal of Laws of 2019, item 1843, as amended hereinafter "PPL") and Article 44 Section 3 Point 1 of the Act of 27.08.2009 on public finance (Journal of Laws of 2017, item 2077, as amended) for the purpose related to the public procurement awarding procedure conducted in the form of an open tender, and in the case of personal data provided by a contractor whose bid was also selected on the basis of Article 6 Section 1 Letter b) of the GDPR to conclude and implement a public procurement contract;
4. Your personal data may be transferred to entities authorized on the basis of legal provisions, to whom documentation of the proceedings based on Article 8 and Article 96 of the PPL are made available;
5. Your personal data will be stored by the Data Controller, in accordance with Article 97 Section 1 of the Public Procurement Law, for a period of 4 years from the date of termination of the contract awarding procedure, and if the duration of the contract exceeds 4 years, the storage period covers the entire duration of the contract, and in the case of contracts implemented under projects (e.g. co-financed from European Union funds) for the period indicated in the guidelines relating to the eligibility of expenses;
6. Your obligation to provide personal data is a statutory requirement, specified in the provisions of the Public Procurement Law, related to participation in the public procurement procedure (the consequences of not providing specific data result from the Public Procurement Law). In the case of procurement procedures excluded from the provisions of

the Public Procurement Law, providing data is voluntary, however, their absence will prevent participation in the procedure;

7. With regard to your personal data, decisions will not be taken in an automated manner, applicable to Article 22 of the GDPR;

8. You have:

- the right to access your personal data based on Article 15 of the GDPR;

- the right to rectify your personal data based on Article 16 of the GDPR (*Explanation: exercising the right to rectification may not result in a change in the outcome of the public procurement procedure or a change in the provisions of the contract to the extent that does not comply with the Public Procurement Law and cannot violate the integrity of the protocol and its appendices*);

- the right to request the Data Controller to limit the processing of personal data based on Article 18 of the GDPR, subject to the cases referred to in Article 18 Section 2 of the GDPR (*Explanation: the right to limit processing does not apply to storage, for ensuring the use of legal remedies or for protecting the rights of another natural or legal person, or for important reasons of public interest of the European Union or a Member State*);

- the right to lodge a complaint to the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection, if you feel that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR;

9. You are not entitled to:

- the right to delete your personal data in connection with Article 17 Section 3 Letter b), d) or e) of the GDPR;

- the right to transfer personal data referred to in Article 20 of the GDPR;

- the right to object to the processing of personal data based on Article 21 of the GDPR, as the legal basis for the processing of your personal data is Article 6 Section 1 Letter c) of the GDPR.
